Jesus Calms the Storm

In Rembrandt's painting, the disciples who are in the boat with Jesus react differently to the storm.

An interesting observation about the painting is that, in addition to the twelve disciples who were caught in the storm, there is a thirteenth person in the boat together with Jesus. Who does this person represent? Can you find yourself in Rembrandt's painting?

- ✓ Which disciple do you most identify with?
- M How do you react to the 'storms' of your life?
- Take the decision to fix your eyes on Jesus during the 'storms' you experience
- ✓ Listen to Him saying: "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"
- Write a prayer on a paper boat and ask Jesus to calm the 'storms' you are facing at the moment



Jesus Calms the Storm

- That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." ³⁶ Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. ³⁷ A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. ³⁸ Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?"
- ³⁹ He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm.
- ⁴⁰ He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"
- ⁴¹ They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"
